SILVIO AMORI

THE INAUGURATION OF THE 89TH PRESIDENT
ROTARY CLUB OF NEW YORK

Silvio Amori, a native of Florence, Italy, joined the Rotary Club of New York in 1993. He also was a member at the Milan Rotary Club. He holds a degree in economics from Bocconi University in Milan and received an honorary degree from the University of Tourism in Naples in 1983. In 1991, he received the honorary title of Cavaliere from the President of the Italian Republic for outstanding achievements in his profession. He speaks Italian, English, French, Brazilian Portuguese, Spanish, and has some knowledge of German and Swedish.

In 1966, he founded the Tour Operator Hotur, whose trademark he sold in 1989. During his 23 years as the owner of Hotur, he operated in the area of charters. From 1961 to 1965, he worked with tour operator I Grandi Viaggi in Milan, rising to the position of Assistant to the Managing Director. From 1968 to 1976 and from 1984 to 1992 he was member of the Executive Committee of the Milanese branch of FIAVET, the Italian federation of travel agencies representing approximately 500 members in Milan. In 1984, he was among the founders of the Professional Committee of Italian Tour Operators and served as its President until 1990. He was a member of the National Executive Committee of FIAVET from 1984 to 1991, representing approximately 2,500 members in Italy. From 1989 to 1991, Amori was national Vice President of FIAVET.

He is currently President of Tourexpert Corp. and the owner of Il Covo dell'Est Restaurant.
